Panopticon, Sybase to Deliver Visual Data Dashboards

Panopticon Software Thursday said it was going to begin providing its customers with a visual dashboard of financial data, using complex event processing, in a partnership with Sybase.

Panopticon, based in Stockholm, [said its software](#) for visualizing, monitoring and analyzing financial data would connect directly to Sybase's Trading Edition of its RAP market analytics program as well as the Sybase Aleri Complex Event Processing engine.

Sybase, a provider of systems based on relational databases, [acquired Aleri](#), a pioneer of the type of software that allows traders to pull in large amounts of data and quickly analyze it, in February. Sybase also specializes in software for mobile uses.

Last week, Sybase in Stockholm, said it [agreed to be acquired by SAP](#), the German supplier of planning and management software for large corporations.

"The addition of the Panopticon real-time online analytical processing and visual analysis toolset will allow multiple user communities to achieve highly specialized yet bespoke visualization on a consistent view of data and analytics," said Stuart Grant, business development manager for Sybase.

"It's extremely important for senior managers to have clear visibility into trading activities, associated risk exposures and profitability metrics across the enterprise," said Willem De Geer, managing director of Panopticon. The dashboards will allow visual analysis of multiple dimensions of real-time and historical data, for numerical analysis, pre-trade risk analysis and overall market monitoring, he said.
